CONSTRUCTION GRAMMAR FORTY YEARS AFTER – CONSTRUCTIONS ALL THE WAY UP!

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This presentation has three parts to it: first, I'll give the basics of (Fillmorean) Construction Grammar (CxG) for those who would like to know what it's all about - and I'll very briefly situate it in relation to other models; second, I'll talk a little bit about the kind of CxG I have myself been developing during the last twenty years, Construction Discourse (CxD). The third part is very much work-in-progress that I've started with Tomas Lehecka (and we are not really sure it will lead to anything, but I'd very much appreciate your input). The thing is, is that construction grammarians all agree that there are "constructions all the way down", and CxD has taken CxG in the other direction, "upwards". But how far "up" can one go? Is, for instance, a CxG/CxD approach usable to explain/predict whether one asks a wh-question or a y/n-question? Ultimately, do we need a CxB - where "B" stands for 'behavior'?!?
